It may be summer for us, but already the avian return migration is under way. At time of writing there have been reports of 1000's of Swifts leaving from Spurn Point, Yorkshire; and all of the British Trust for Ornithology satellite tagged Cuckoos have left the UK, with two birds in Africa having crossed the Sahara.

In Japan and America crows are using pedestrian crossings to help crack walnuts!!! When the lights change to red, the birds hop in front of the cars and place walnuts which they have picked from the adjoining trees, on the road. As the lights turn green again, the birds fly away and vehicles drive over the nuts, cracking them open. When its time to cross again, the crows join the pedestrians and are able to pick up and eat the contents. (extract from BTO monthly e-news www.bto.org)

# Golden-bloomed Grey Longhorn Beetle Agapanthia villosoviridescens



The adults feed on unbelellifers such as Hogweed and Cow Parsley as well as on nettles. The female chews a small cavity into the stem of the plant and lays her eggs, usually two to a plant. When the larvae hatch they will eat into the pith and make their way to the base of the stem.

Adults can be found from May through to August, flying readily in hot weather.

### Vapourer moth caterpillar

Found feeding on Silver Birch in the Old Hedgerow during July. Easily recognised by the tufts of bristles along the body.
