At one time it was thought that edible fungi were mushrooms and that inedible, poisonous ones were regarded as toadstools. Nowadays there is no distinction between the names.



Unlike plants fungi are unable to produce their own food through photosynthesis, they have to rely on other animal and plant material.

They absorb nutrients from living or dead animal or plant material, by producing enzymes that break down the food into substances that the fungi can absorb. - They are decomposers!

Sections of the Meadow are cut and the arisings removed on an annual rotation.
